Spain. Sandra has also participated in masterclasses with notable conductors and teachers, such as Benjamín Zander, Francesco Belli, Ronald Zollman, Valery Gergiev, Lior Shambadal. In 2018, Sandra was awarded the Alondra de la Parra - Montblanc Scholarship. In June 2020, she won the National Award in the Vienna World Music Competition for Conductors.
