With this orchestra, she began to learn conducting until beginning to attend masterclasses. In 2021, Valentina studied with Jorma Panula in Finland, Carl St.Clair and James Edward Ross in Virginia, and currently studies with Cecilia Espinosa (EAFIT Medellin, Colombia). Additionally, in 2022, Valentina participated as a conducting fellow with the Georgia Symphony Orchestra, along with assisting rehearsals and conducting concerts with the Greater Miami Youth Symphony. Valentina is very passionate about music education, and created *Through the Staff*, a non-profit organization that provides free private music lessons to young students from underprivileged families.
